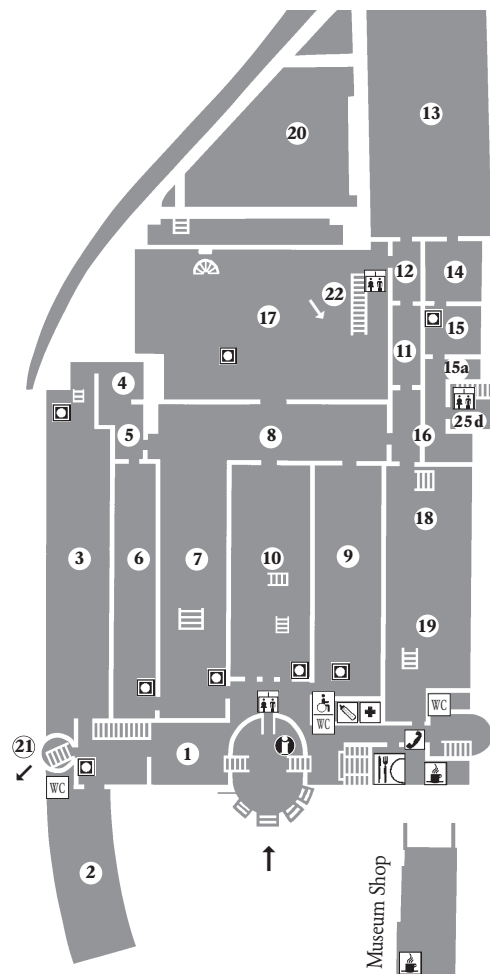
The Deutsches Museum in Bonn’s Science Centre presents 100 highlights from research and development in Germany since 1945.

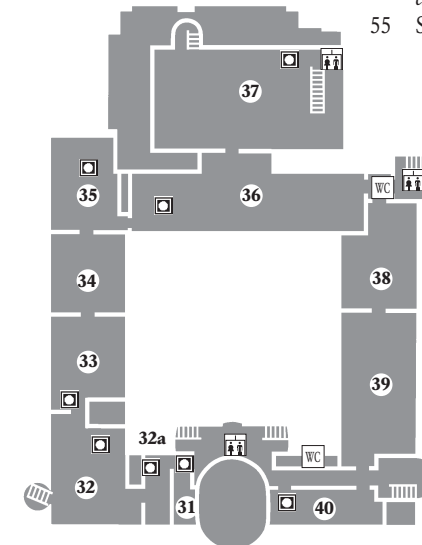

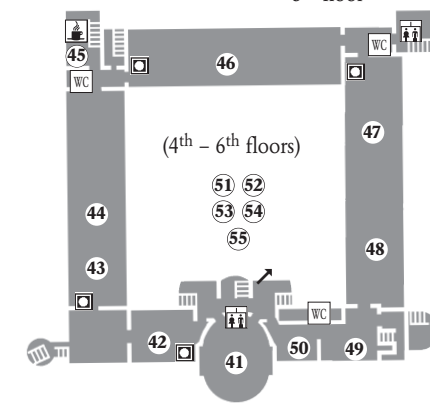
